Boxcars full of bullion!



Christmastime is a time for toys, trains, and other goodies under the tree. A few years ago, Santa brought our family a Lionel Train set. Trains have been a family tradition for decades but the Lionel Train under the Christmas tree was a new tradition for us. To the chagrin of the Queen, but to delight of the children and the author, more train cars continue to appear in the collection. At a recent train show near Cincinnati, I came across a gold bullion boxcar labeled for the Fort Knox Depository. Of course it wasn't really gold but it was fun to think of a boxcar full of "gold" and have that on a toy train running around the tree and what a neat connection to my home state. However, the price compared to eBay values was not competitive so I moved on. Mere minutes later, I came across a San Francisco Mint car, also with gold bullion, at a much nicer price so I purchased this one to give a nod to my numismatic hobby.

I thought nothing more of this bullion box car until this past fall when I was at another model and toy train show and came across, and purchased, a Charlotte Mint gold bullion box car. Whoa – this made me think and come to the conclusion that Lionel Trains has actually produced such bullion cars for all of the classic US Mints, Fort Knox, and it appears Federal Reserve Banks as well.

It is believed that these box cars are a modification of the plastic mold for the classic post war Lionel Aquarium Box Car but with at least three major tweaks: the box cars are full of bullion bars instead of a rotating display of aquatic life, a safe like knob and wheel molded between the windows, and there is a slit on the top of the box car to allow it to be used as a piggy bank. Some of the box cars, including a Dahlonega Mint box car, claim to hold gold bullion. The Denver, New Orleans, and Carson City box cars found on eBay may contain silver bullion instead though. Now that I have two of the classic US Mint bullion box cars I must find and collect the other five classic mints, right? The prices for

Updated Deadline for ANA Summer Seminar Scholarships – Available Online Now

The American Numismatic Association (ANA) is accepting <u>scholarship</u>
<u>applications</u> for its 2025 Summer Seminar, the hobby's premier educational event.
The scholarship deadline from previous years has been updated to January 31, 2025. This change allows earlier access to financial aid for applicants.

Recipients will have the opportunity to attend one of two weeklong sessions, to be held June 21-26 and June 28-July 3 on the Colorado College campus adjacent to ANA headquarters in Colorado Springs, Colorado. All members – both adults and young numismatists (YNs) – are eligible.

YNs can apply for financial aid through the ANA Young Numismatist Scholarship, the Martin D. Weiss Memorial YN Scholarship, the David Lisot Memorial YN Scholarship or the Greg Lyon Memorial YN Scholarship. Applicants must be full-time students, age 13-17.

Adults 18 and older can receive full or partial assistance through the Robert Lecce Adult Scholarship. The Charles O. Browne Scholarship is available for applicants, age 15-25, attending the "Advanced United States Coin Grading and Problem Coins" class. The Everett Hull Scholarship is also available to those ages 15 and older.

Full scholarships for both YNs and adults include room and board for one week, tuition, and airfare, while partial scholarships for all applicants cover tuition only. Recipients will be selected based on need and merit.

<u>Scholarship applications</u> are available at money.org (select "Summer Seminar" from the "Events" menu) and must be postmarked no later than January 31, 2025. For additional information, contact the ANA Seminars Department at (719) 482-9848 or email <u>seminars@money.org</u>.
