Coin Clubs

There are hundreds and hundreds of coin clubs across the United States and the world. A majority of these clubs have a localized focus much like our coin club, the Bluegrass Coin Club. Our members are mostly from Lexington, the Bluegrass Region, or the beautiful hills of Appalachia. We also have a few members who live beyond the borders of our Commonwealth. There are several more coin clubs in Kentucky and a few notable clubs just beyond our borders that many of us are also a member of. Furthermore, there is what I call super regional clubs such as the Central States Numismatic Society and the Blue Ridge Numismatic Association who serve coin collectors across vast regions of the county and usually hold at least one major convention a year and offer education programs to promote the hobby. Then there are national coin clubs such as the American Numismatic Association and the American Numismatic Society who have a national focus with employed staff, have major conventions, and may also lobby or advise the federal government on coinage and paper money matters. Finally, there are special interest clubs such as the Liberty Seated Collectors Club or the Token and Medal Society whose focus is more about a specific type of numismatic interest. The Liberty Seated Collectors Club sends the Bluegrass Coin Club a monthly E-Gobrecht newsletter in PDF format with several pages of news, research articles, and advertisements about Liberty Seated coinage events or related information. We receive this complimentary newsletter since we are an ANA club member. Starting with this newsletter, we will share the E-Gobrecht newsletter email via a link next to the auction information. Updated Deadline for ANA Summer Seminar Scholarships – Available Online Now

The American Numismatic Association (ANA) is accepting <u>scholarship</u> <u>applications</u> for its 2025 Summer Seminar, the hobby's premier educational event. The scholarship deadline from previous years has been updated to January 31, 2025. This change allows earlier access to financial aid for applicants.

Recipients will have the opportunity to attend one of two weeklong sessions, to be held June 21-26 and June 28-July 3 on the Colorado College campus adjacent to ANA headquarters in Colorado Springs, Colorado. All members – both adults and young numismatists (YNs) – are eligible.

YNs can apply for financial aid through the ANA Young Numismatist Scholarship, the Martin D. Weiss Memorial YN Scholarship, the David Lisot Memorial YN Scholarship or the Greg Lyon Memorial YN Scholarship. Applicants must be full-time students, age 13-17.

Adults 18 and older can receive full or partial assistance through the Robert Lecce Adult Scholarship. The Charles O. Browne Scholarship is available for applicants, age 15-25, attending the "Advanced United States Coin Grading and Problem Coins" class. The Everett Hull Scholarship is also available to those ages 15 and older.

Full scholarships for both YNs and adults include room and board for one week, tuition, and airfare, while partial scholarships for all applicants cover tuition only. Recipients will be selected based on need and merit.

<u>Scholarship applications</u> are available at money.org (select "Summer Seminar" from the "Events" menu) and must be postmarked no later than January 31, 2025. For additional information, contact the ANA Seminars Department at (719) 482-9848 or email <u>seminars@money.org</u>.

Bluegrass Coin Club Member Highlight

In this edition of the Bluegrass Coin Club Meet and Greet Section, we interviewed Dr. Ken Miller. Thank you for sharing, Dr. Ken.

What do you collect?

A: Most all of my coins are post-Civil War issues of virtually all denominations but pretty concentrated with Morgan silver dollars, Barber coinage, etc.

Q: How did you get started collecting?

A: Well, I kind of just fell into the hobby. My father-in-law got me interested in the hobby because he knew I was a history buff. I took an interest in the collection and am currently learning as much as I am able about coin grading and the numismatic hobby. Recently, I completed the six courses in the ANA's Numismatic Diploma Program and am working toward getting the Numismatic Scholar Certificate. I also just got back from the ANA Summer Seminar in Colorado, where I took Grading I from Kyle Knapp and Owen Seymour of PCGS.

Q: What is your favorite part about being a member of BGCC?

A: The July meeting was my first one, so I was surprised to hear a couple of people call out to me as "Dr. Ken." I am a long-term business and management professor at Sullivan University and the former owner of *Coffee News*, a weekly publication which was distributed for years in Lexington restaurants and grocery stores until April of 2020. Mainly, I now work from home and teach primarily online courses, so it's great to get out of the house and see somebody besides my wife. :-) Here's something interesting: Bob Jones, the club's representative to the ANA, and his sister are former MBA students of mine.
