December Guest Speaker Meeting Information

Ben Costello is President of the 1715 Fleet Society and is our guest speaker for our Christmas Banquet meeting. He is an expert on shipwreck coinage from the 1715 Spanish Treasure Fleet disaster. Mr. Costello offers the following regarding his presentation:

"This presentation deals with a little discussed and largely unknown aspect of collecting shipwreck treasure...the hunt for encrusted material. What this is and why it has such a huge following in the shipwreck community is what this presentation is about. These objects have a certain beauty and alure that they are often referred to as "Ocean Art". Why these items are the objects of desire is what will be featured in this presentation. Treasure coins that are cleaned and slabbed have a certain place in the market. But for the true believer these clumps, aggregates and EO's represent a certain aspect of the history of a shipwreck that cannot be matched by slabbed coins. They represent how coins and encrusted objects became part of the ocean's environment, untouched by human hands, and historically undisturbed since the day that the ship that carried them was itself consumed by the ocean."
